



Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Amendment Rules 2005

Pursuant to section 40(2) of the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002, the Institution of Professional Engineers of New Zealand Incorporated, after complying with rule 86 of the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Rules (No 2) 2002, makes the following rules.

Rules

1 Title

- (1) These rules are the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Amendment Rules 2005.
- (2) In these rules, the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Rules (No 2) 2002¹ are called “the principal rules”.

2 Commencement

These rules come into force on 1 January 2006.

3 Way in which assessment panel must evaluate application

Rule 11(1) of the principal rules is amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraph:

- “(b) do all of the following, unless the panel thinks it unnecessary (in which case, it may carry out one or more, or none, of the following):
- “(i) carry out an interactive assessment with the applicant by any meeting method; and
 - “(ii) require the applicant to carry out a written assignment; and
 - “(iii) carry out an assessment of the applicant’s engineering knowledge by any method the panel considers appropriate; and”.

4 New Schedule 2 substituted

The principal rules are amended by revoking Schedule 2, and substituting the Schedule 2 set out in the Schedule of these rules.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 1 January 2006, amend the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Rules (No 2) 2002.

The main change is to the amounts of the fees for initial and continued registration. New fee amounts are set out in a *new Schedule 2*. In addition, these rules create a new way in which an assessment panel can evaluate an application to be registered as a chartered professional engineer.
